

# Teaching as Service



## ***How will my service make an impact?***

To date, almost 300 VTC members have served in Chicago schools. In addition to bringing dedicated, energetic young teachers into the classroom, savings created by their simple lifestyle choices have provided almost \$1,750,000 in scholarship funds. Over 15,000 children have been taught thus far.

## ***Which schools are Corps members placed in?***

VTC members will most likely be placed at Catholic schools in underserved areas on the South and West sides of Chicago. The students at these schools are mostly African American or Latino. Other school possibilities include Charter, Episcopal, Lutheran, and year-round placements. Applicants should be open to all of these possibilities.

## ***What grade levels can I teach?***

Most of our Corps members are teaching in Kindergarten to Eighth Grade classrooms. Most primary placements are self-contained classrooms, while intermediate and junior high placements are usually divided up by subject area. You may be eligible for teaching high school if you have a Math or Science background. Please inquire with our VTC Recruitment Coordinator to see if that could be a possibility for you.

## ***How do you decide which grade level I will be teaching?***

During the interview process you will be asked to fill out an applicant questionnaire listing the grade level and subject areas you are most interested in teaching. We will do our best to place you within the grade levels that you list. If this is not possible, you will be consulted before any placement decisions are made.

## ***Can I coach or sponsor extracurricular activities at my school?***

Many Corps members are involved in extracurricular activities at their schools, for example, coaching sports teams, starting school newspapers, moderating student councils, organizing book clubs, or directing plays. Up to \$400 per year is available to each Corps member to support extracurricular activities at their school.

## ***What resources are available for my classroom?***

Each Corps member receives \$100 in start-up funds each September, and \$50 per month after to purchase and maintain classroom supplies. Corps members are also encouraged to use our Resource Center. Located in the ICTC office, it is full of teaching materials, and also includes a laminator, letter-cutter, and copier specifically for your use.
